GMPA QUADRENNIAL REPORT (2015-2018) TO UN ECOSOC

1. Introduction

Global Migration Policy Associates (GMPA) is an international expert network with members and activities in all world regions.

2. Aims and purposes of the organization and its course of action

GMPA members individually and collectively deliver multi-disciplinary research, policy development, expert advisory services, training and advocacy advancing rights- and knowledge-based governance of migration, realisation of human rights for all, and promoting just and sustainable development.

3. Any change that may have had a significant impact

GMPA experienced substantial increase in scope and complexity of projects.

4. Your contribution to the work of the UN

GMPA pursued a strategic multi-disciplinary approach to advance realisation of human rights, sustainable development, and human welfare/well-being, supporting implementation of United Nations normative instruments and policy agendas.

Activity focussed on: application of UN Human Rights Conventions; International Labour Standards; the Sustainable Development Agenda; and the New Urban Agenda. Attention was also directed to health and migration, *cities welcoming migrants*, UN coordination on migration, and development of the Global Compact on Migration.

Accomplishments and products included:

- Ongoing promotion of ratification and domestication by States of the International Convention
 on the Protection of the Rights of All Migrant Workers and Members of Their Families (ICRMW)
 and ILO Conventions 97 on migration for employment and 143 on migrant workers.
- Elaboration of the African Union-ILO-IOM-UNECA (Economic Commission for Africa) Joint Labour Migration Programme (JLMP) for Africa, formally *adopted* in January 2015 by African Heads of State and Government, as a comprehensive programme on migration governance.
- Research and co-publication (2016) of a first international analytical report on *cities welcoming migrants and refugees* in cooperation with UNESCO.
- Preparation of a comprehensive matrix on application of the 2030 Sustainable Development Agenda to migrants, refugees, migration and migration compelling situations. (2016, 2018)

- Preparation of a comprehensive review of protection of rights of migrants and refugees in Europe with reference to UN and ILO conventions, published by Caritas Europa (2016)
- Research and preparation for ILO (in consultation with UNAIDS) of the first global manual on migration, health, human rights and HIV & AIDS, launched February 2018.
- Contributing inputs to preparation of the inter-governmental Global Compact on Migration (2017-2018).
- Preparing a first *handbook for cities* on reception, inclusion and integration of migrants and refugees, under UNESCO auspices. (2017-2018; forthcoming 2020)

6. Your cooperation with UN Bodies

As noted above, GMPA cooperated extensively with ILO and UNESCO.

GMPA engaged with OHCHR, the Human Rights Council, several Special Rapporteurs, and human rights Treaty Bodies CERD and CMW.

GMPA interacted in research, consultative dialogue and in meetings and conferences with ESCAP, IOM, UNAIDS, UNICEF, UNU-GCM, and WHO.

7. Your initiatives taken in support of the MDGs/SDGs

The GMPA *Migration and SDG Matrix* identifies 45 targets across 16 of 17 SDGs, linking migration-development rationales with Sustainable Development Agenda goals and targets, respective implementing actions, measurement indicators, and baseline data sources.

The GMPA-produced ILO-published *Framework for Action on a rights-based approach to migration, health and HIV & AIDS* (2017) contributes to implementation of Sustainable Development Goal on healthy lives and well-being for all, and other SDGs.

The UNESCO-published Cities Welcoming Refugees and Migrants (2016) by GMPA features urban governance in implementing SDG 11 on inclusive and sustainable cities and human settlements as well as the New Urban Agenda.

In 2018, GMPA contributed research to 11 *Caritas* national studies in EU countries on *migration and development* explicitly tying migration to the Sustainable Development Agenda.

Elaboration of the 2030 Sustainable Development Agenda in global knowledge-sharing and training activities for the International Training Center of the ILO in Turin.
